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Job Description

We seek an individual committed to excellence in undergraduate teaching to join the Computer Science teaching faculty as a Teaching Assistant Professor, which is our equivalent to a Professor of Practice. A master's in Computer Science, Computer Engineering, or a closely related field is required; a Ph.D. is preferred. Applicants should feel comfortable teaching computer science majors, including introductory programming courses through data structures, and will have the opportunity to teach upper-level electives based on expertise. Candidates in all areas of specialization will be considered, and qualified applicants will have the opportunity to teach in our Data Science Masters' and undergraduate programs as well.

Teaching load will be four courses each in fall and spring, with no required summer teaching. Generally faculty teach at most two different courses in any given semester. The candidate will assist the department in curricular development, review, and assessment, as well as contribute to the educational mission of Loyola University Maryland. Teaching faculty are full members of the department, who vote

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on department decisions and influence department curriculum.

Required Qualifications

- Masters' degree in Computer Science or related field
- Expertise in Java, Python, or a similar high-level programming language

Preferred Qualifications

- Ph.D. in Computer Science or a closely related discipline
- Teaching experience in upper-level computer science courses
- An appreciation of or engagement in high-impact teaching practices
- Commitment to the goals of education in the Jesuit tradition
- The awareness of approaches for creating a sense of inclusion and belonging in the classroom

Applicants must submit the following online

- A cover letter noting why the applicant is interested in this position, listing teaching interests and summarizing relevant experience.
- A up-to-date curriculum vitae.
- A teaching statement that includes your philosophy of teaching, a summary of your teaching experiences, and the courses that you are interested in and able to teach.
