- Maintain and update daily inventory of laboratory supplies and reagents, processing orders through BearBuy and liaising with vendors to ensure timely delivery.
- Oversee procurement activities to support continuous research operations.
- Perform all benchwork tasks along with ordering and restocking laboratory supplies.
- Coordinate maintenance and schedule external calibration for laboratory equipment, including centrifuges, spectrophotometers, and biosafety cabinets, and arrange repairs as needed to ensure smooth laboratory operations.
